Snack foods firm expands in Hauppauge

A Long Island snack foods manufacturer is expanding with its lease of a building in Hauppauge.

EatingEvolved, which makes organic, dairy free, gluten free, paleo and vegan snack foods, leased a 32,340-square-foot industrial building on 2.08 acres at 135 Ricefield Lane in the Long Island Innovation Park at Hauppauge. The company is relocating from East Setauket.

Founded in 2012 by Rick Gusmano and Christine Cusano, EatingEvolved's products are sold at Whole Foods, Wegman's, Wild by Nature, HEB and Hy-Vee supermarkets. Some of the company's most popular offerings are cashew milk chocolate bars and low-sugar keto cups.

Edward Pidgeon of Coldwell Banker Commercial Island Corporate Services represented the tenant, while Chris Costa and Ted Trias were the in-house representatives for landlord Rechler Equity Partners in the lease transaction.
